


NEWSLETTER - March 2023

The North of England displayed a wide range of genera.





Phil Howard's peloric* Cymbidium King Freak x devonianum



^{*}For anyone unfamiliar with the term, peloria is the term given to the mutation where the upper petals or, as in this cymbidium, the lower half of the sepals take on the colours, patterning or structural characteristics of the labellum (the "lip" petal of the orchid).


North of England OS Show, Saturday 11th March 2023


