



### A Visit to the Eric Young Orchid Foundation, Jersey - John Gay

After lunch, John Gay, gave the first part of what will be a two-part presentation on the Eric Young Orchid Foundation (EYOF) which he knows well, his most recent visit being in December 2022 as a member of the RHS Orchid Committee. The slides included photographs taken by John himself, Chris Purver, Curator of the Foundation, and BOC's Helen Milner.

We learnt about the Foundation's location – places on Jersey have French names and these are used by the EYOF when naming orchids - and the history of the Foundation.

We also learnt that the founder, Eric Young, a wealthy businessman and orchid enthusiast, was born, somewhat surprisingly, in Derbyshire, in 1911.

When Eric died suddenly in 1984, he had had the foresight to make plans for his orchid collection for after his death.

The Foundation is a charitable trust whose trustees are orchid experts.

There is a show house, which is open to the public nearly every day of the year, a growing area comprising 8 greenhouses and a laboratory, and a library.

Eric Young established one of the finest private libraries in the world, containing such rarities as Bateman's Orchids of Mexico and Guatemala and Lindenia. The library also houses the history of all the Foundation's plants and their paintings.

The second part of John's presentation will focus on the Foundation's growing area and, to whet our appetites, John closed this first part with a teaser.

It was a photograph, taken in the Foundation's growing area, of a new Phragmipedium: Phragmipedium Teighmore, and it had Phrag lovers in the audience drooling. Apparently only 6 plants resulted from the cross of Phrag Jersey x Phrag Fremont Point. It was a beauty – with amazing colour, and shapely too. Poor Pat Hollings was quite overcome!

#### RHS Orchid Show at RHS Garden Wisley, Surrey

#### 17th - 19th March 2023

I recently had the pleasure of attending what was originally the London Orchid Show, now renamed the Wisley Orchid Show, which was, of course, held at RHS Wisley, in the new Hilltop Centre. This is a purpose-built Exhibition Hall with lecture facilities, meeting rooms and a cafeteria.

This year, the show was held over the period from Friday 17<sup>th</sup> March to Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> March. Prior to the show, I attended a training day on the Thursday, which was designed as a refresher day for some 60 RHS Floral/Garden judges.

In an early start on the first day of the show, I joined together with four other judges to judge the ten exhibits in the Hall. We gave four Gold medals which went to Burnham Nurseries, The Mathers Foundation, Helen Milner and Elite Orchids for outstanding exhibits, with the Mathers Foundation taking best overall display.

There were three Orchid Societies exhibiting; namely, Bournemouth Orchid Society (Silver-Gilt), Thames Valley Orchid Society (Silver) and the Orchid Society of Great Britain (Silver), plus an exhibit by Writhlington School (Silver-Gilt).


There were a number of great talks over the period of the show. After the judging was completed, I gave a talk to the public entitled 'An Introduction to Orchids'.

The following day, Saturday, I sat on the RHS Orchid Committee to judge 39 plants, which, I think, was a record number for me and took over four hours; to say the least, a mammoth task, especially since I had to drive home afterwards in time for a meeting and AGM of the Harrogate Orchid Society on the Sunday.


